

# **ABOUT PONDO NG PINOY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION, INC. (PNPCFI)**



### WHO WE ARE

Pondo ng Pinoy Community Foundation, Inc. aims to develop a Filipino culture rooted more deeply in love of God and neighbor, especially the poor, through little but repeated acts of compassion, solidarity and sharing. Pondo ng Pinoy issues the clarion call towards the attainment of fullness of life in God. Although initiated by the Church, PnPCFI is a community foundation, wherein the community owns the fund it generates. Sharing as little as twenty-five centavos (PhP 0.25) becomes "integrating moment" in the catechetical framework. It is the concrete expression of love "lived for others". PnPCFI intends to help needy Filipinos, within and beyond the Catholic Church.

### **OUR VISION**

A Filipino community where God reigns, and the Love of God is experienced in small but repeated acts of goodness towards neighbor, bringing hope and fullness of life to all, especially the poor.

### **OUR HISTORY**

In 1982, from a farming town in Malaybalay, Bukidnon, the church, led by then Bishop Gaudencio Rosales, and its people began to act as one with the belief that even the smallest thing they can do, if done for and with others, will have a tremendous impact. Archbishop Rosales brought this vision with him and nurtured it in his heart when he was transferred to Lipa, Batangas in 1993. To instill in the faithful the belief that faith in and love of God do not depend on extraordinary acts, but on ordinary acts done with regularity, the Archdiocese of Lipa asked for "crumbs" from the parishioners. The "crumbs" is any amount parishioners can give. As time moved on, the "crumbs" amounted to 25 centavos, negligible to many, become a big help if pooled together and given regularly as emphasized in the phrase "Anumang magaling, kahit maliit, basta't malimit ay patungong langit." This system of gathering small donations grew over the years, expanding to other areas, and finally becoming a national movement known as Pondo ng Pinoy. Pondo ng Pinoy came into existence after Gaudencio B. Cardinal Rosales was appointed archbishop of the Archdiocese of Manila. Cardinal Rosales launched the Pondo ng Pinoy Program at the Folk Arts Theater on June 11-12, 2004.

Pondo ng Pinoy is not just a fundraising scheme, but primarily a means of catechesis

– a way of changing the hearts and minds of people, so that they may give and share
with the less fortunate, not simply out of compassion, but out of love.

# Emmaus House of Apostolate

San Agustin, Malolos City Bulacan

Emmaus House of Apostolate is a home for sixty (60) female abandoned and sickly elderly. This is a priority program of the Diocese of Malolos, Bulacan, Pondo ng Pinoy's long-time partner.

This Emmaus House does not content itself to mere provisions of the needs of the elderly, rather, it finds a deeper fulfillment when it is able to gain one lost soul back to the Father's fold. People from all walks of life support this apostolate with a common desire to sanctify themselves through personal sacrifice for the poor, the sick, and the dying.

Your crumbs support the repair of this home. The old decayed and rotten ward is now a comfortable place to stay for these abandoned and sickly elderlies.

### Educational Assistance for Underprivileged Children and Youth

Pondo ng Pinoy believes in investing for the future of the young people, that is why in Fiscal Years 2018–2019 and 2019–2020 and in partnership with eight (8) local communities, the movement provided opportunity to around five hundred (500) underprivileged children and youth to go to school.

One of PnPCFl's long-term partner, Caritas Manila, fulfilled the dreams of around 500 youth-scholars from 2018-2020 to enter tertiary education.

Caritas Manila's program is called Youth Servant Leadership and Education Program (YSLEP). Its' unique approach is its formation and parish/community service program component which cultivates the spirit of charity. On the other hand, a student beneficiary of the Diocese of Ilagan's scholarship program shared:

"Isang oportunidad po para sa akin na maging isang iskolar ng simbahan. Malaki ang naitulong nito sa akin at sa aking pamilya. Ito ay nakatulong upang matustusan ang aking pangangailangan sa paaralan. Bilang isang iskolar at miyembrong simbahan, marami ang nabago sa aking buhay. Lumalim pa lalo ang aking pananampalataya sa Panginoon. Natutunan ko ang pakikipag-kapwa tao, pagkakaroon ng tiwala sa sarili at pagtulong sa aking kapwa ng bukal sa aking puso. Dati basta nagsisimba lang ako pero ngayon masaya ako dahil hindi na lang ako basta nagsisimba kung hindi bilang isang lingcod ng Panginoon. Ako po ay labis na nagpapasalamat dahil meron po kayo na kaagapay naming sa aming pag-aaral. Marami pa po sana kayong matulungan na kagaya po naming na nangangarap. # ARNOLD JANSSEN KALINGA CENTER Kain, Aral, Llgo NG Ayos (Eat, Learn, Bathe to be Well)

AJ KALINGA Foundation, Inc. (AJKF, Inc.) continues to serve as a beacon of hope for Metro Manila's homeless and poorest of the poor. It envisions a society where nobody is left behind, and the dignity of all people is respected and upheld. It has two major programs: a) Arnold Janssen KALINGA Center and b) the Program PAGHILOM.

The Arnold Janssen Kalinga Center (AJKC) is a center that seeks to serve the poorest of the poor, street dwellers and marginalized. AJKC is a sanctuary for many street dwellers in the area of Tayuman, Manila and other nearby areas. It is enlivened by its vision of "recreating and empowering lives of the poor." Its undivided mission is to provide dignified, systematic and holistic CARE. This mission is being done in three (3) holistic Phases: Phase 1: Food and Hygiene to recreate their self image Phase 2: Alternative Learning System (ALS) to reclaim their self-respect and, Phase 3: Livelihood and Employment to restore their selfworth. This program seeks to provide "kalinga" or care to street dwellers facing massive poverty, hunger, and substance abuse among many other issues. In the 'Eat-Bathe' phase, upon entering the center, the beneficiaries are provided facilities, shower kits and clean clothes to bathe and clean themselves.

This phase alone of seeing themselves before and after bathing provides a significant transformation from the point they entered the center to being clean and clothed decently. Then they are given food which they eat in a common dining area. In the second phase, 'Eat-Learn-Bathe', they learn the basics of reading and writing [through the Department of Education (DepEd) accredited Alternative Learning System (ALS)] as well as values formation. The last phase, 'Livelihood-Employment', hopes to help those finding livelihood and employment.

Being a community-based program, Arnold Janssen Kalinga Centre has journeyed with the street dwellers in Tayuman and provided the most basic needs deprived of them, helping re-create self-image, re-claim self-respect, and restore self-worth that may have been trampled with a seemingly hopeless environment they live in. With the center, the presence of the Church has become more transparent and real, reaching out to the least, the last, and the lost.



Pondo ng Pinoy shares in this journey by supporting the center's program expenses together with other donors' support. With the center gaining much impact on their persons and on their lives, the beneficiaries have the opportunity to voluntarily give coins to a "Pondo ng Pinoy Piggy Bank" stationed in the center. Inspired by the Pondo ng Pinoy Piggy Bank, the Kalinga beneficiaries shared their coins for the affected families of typhoon "Tisoy" in 2019. St. Hannibal Empowerment Center, Inc. or SHEC started in an urban poor area in Pasay City, Metro Manila. It was a densely populated community typical of marginalized families – no decent housing, no sanitation, people had odd jobs and crimes and drug issues were rampant.

Then came the Rogationist priests and brothers who immersed with these families. Their presence, time, and sincerity in listening to the people gained them the community's trust. Gradually, the people "felt the presence of God" again and they started to hope and dream for a better, humane future. The constant guidance of the Rogationists enabled them to reflect on their values, review their life perspectives, relive their capacity to care for others. They have become more prayerful and trusting of God.

In 2005, they were formally organized into Saint Hannibal Christian Community (SHaCC) and Port Atea of Baseco Neighborhood Associations' League (PABaNAL) organizations.

# We are committed to transform communities

With constant formation and training, the members developed their leadership skills, developed their talents, analyzed their situations, learned to interact with different groups, discovered their capacity to manage their own organizations, and decided on the best for the community. To realize the "New Heaven and New Earth" that they have been aspiring for is already becoming a reality despite their limitations and the contradictions from others.

One of the blessings they received was the relentless presence of the Church and the support they gained from Pondo ng Pinoy through Archbishop Gaudencio Cardinal Rosales that made a seemingly impossible dream possible – to have their own houses and lots right in their community. Learning how to process documents and with the collaboration with different individuals and agencies, around 479 families now live in decent housing. This paved the way for other partnerships for developing health programs and establishing health centers, providing livelihood and education, skills trainings and so on and so forth. To date, other communities have been inspired and organized to fulfill fullness of life to all especially the poor, by empowering them to empower others as well. Pasig Catholic College Volunteers to pack locally-produced rice for the Hapag-Asa Supplemental Feeding Program

Hapag-Asa Integrated Nutrition Program is a Catholic response to the malnutrition situation among children in the country. It was launched in July 2005 by Pondo ng Pinoy Community Foundation, Inc. then headed by Archbishop Gaudencio B. Cardinal Rosales in partnership with thirteen (13) dioceses, Assisi Development Foundation, Feed the Children Philippines, and recently Feed My Starving Children, Risen Savior Mission, and recently Feed My Starving Children, Risen Savior Missions, Catholic Bishop's Conference of the Philippines-National Secretariat for Social Action (CBCP-NASSA), Caritas Filipinas Foundation and Episcopal Commission on Health Care.

The program offers provision of supplemental feeding and non-formal education for undernourished children, and livelihood activities for their parents.

Eradicating malnutrition especially stunting among children still has a long way to go. With only just few hours of your time and your own two hands, children's hunger can be turned into hope.

### VOLUNTEER, DONATE, AND FEED A HUNGRY CHILD

On October 17, 2019 the Diocese of Pasig in partnership with Feed My Starving Children (FMSC), launched the Joined Hands Global Pack at the Tahanan ng Mabuting Pastol, C. Raymundo Avenue, Caniogan, Pasig City. The

event featured three hundred (300) volunteer students, faculty members, and non-teaching staff of Pasig Catholic College, who packed locally produced rice that will be fed to undernourished

children enrolled in the Hapag-Asa Nutrition Program.

Aside from generating awareness about the Catholic Church's response to end malnutrition, the event likewise hopes to help farming families sustain their livelihoods through direct purchase of their produced rice from farmers' cooperatives.


Over the years, Pondo ng Pinoy helped fed over two hundred thousand (200,000) undernourished children and has witnessed heartwarming stories of restored hopes.

Pondo ng Pinoy Community Foundation, Inc. with 49 Dioceses assisted the poor communities with food, hygiene kits, medical kits and cash assistance when Covid-19 pandemic hit our country.









### **DIOCESE OF CALBAYOG**

The impact of the global spread of COVID-19 deeply affected the lives of many people. However, this pandemic did not impede your #ChurchInAction frontliners to continue sustaining our endeavors – to help those who are in need. The Diocese of Calbayog initiated a relief operation to 488 families under 7 parishes namely Our Lady's Nativity Parish, St. Roche Mission Center, Most Trinity Parish, Holy Infant Parish, St. Ferrer Parish, St. James the Greater Parish and St. Michael Parish led by Fr. Tito Voz in coordination with Pondo ng Pinoy Community Foundation, Inc. (PnPCFI).

# IMMEDIATE RESPONSE FOR THE POOR



## <u>Diocesan Social Action Ministry of the Diocese of Daet</u> (<u>DSAM-DAET</u>)

Pondo ng Pinoy partner, Diocese of Daet, through the Diocesan Social Action Ministry reached out to 170 families whose livelihood were affected during the enhanced community quarantine. Among the pressing concern that made the situation of these families doubly hard was they live in far flung barangays, and some were even homeless. But the volunteers of the Diocesan Social Action Ministry of the Diocese of Daet (DSAM-DAET) were never disheartened to reach out to communities where few others were present. These passionate volunteers passed through roads and bridges to provide life-giving aid. The Church of the Poor ensured swift response during this time of crisis. Thank you to our passionate and committed partners and volunteers who brought about changes in the lives of many individuals and families in a huge number of ways within and across Pondo ng Pinoy's causes.



#### **DIOCESE OF NOVALICHES**

"No one is so poor as to have nothing to give" (PCP 2). This message captured the experience of the Diocese of Novaliches' volunteers during their relief operation activities for poor families affected by the enhanced community quarantine. Volunteers learned the story of two family beneficiaries who shared a part of their cash assistance to purchase diapers for bedridden elderly in their community.

Pondo ng Pinoy, along with its twenty nice church partners, is committed to continue supporting poor and marginalized groups to address educational, livelihood and health needs, most specially in this time of crisis.

# CARING FOR THE POOR IS THE CORE OF OUR VISION

### **COORDINATOR'S MEETING**

Pondo ng Pinoy Community Foundation, Inc.'s work is delivered through twenty nine (29) local churches in the Philippines. With the hope to strengthen its work and mission through and with the local churches, the past year, the Foundation held two national gatherings of (said) partners' leaders and volunteers.

Led by Pondo ng Pinoy's Chairman Emeritus, His Eminence Luis Antonio G. Cardinal Tagle, D.D., a general assembly of partners were held on October 1, 2019. The assembly was an opportunity for participants to gather valuable experiences, stories and insights from running the Pondo ng Pinoy

programs. As shared by PnPCFI's Executive Director, Ms. Morena A. Cosare, "this assembly is a recognition of the sustained commitment and participation of the Foundation's local partners – dioceses, parishes and schools – to the vision of Pondo ng Pinoy and sharing of strengthened strategies for the Filipino communities to genuinely feel the presence of the love of God and of the Church of the Poor.









### PONDO NG PINOY GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2019

The heart of faith in action is journeying with people. Pondo ng Pinoy journeys with volunteers (priest, religious, and lay) who are aware of the felt needs of the people we prioritize to assist or help. On November 25–26, 2019, Pondo ng Pinoy gathered fifty volunteers representing the twenty nine local church partners. The highlight of the two day activity was the learning review in a form of dialogue, which was a unique opportunity for both employees and volunteers to discuss how to further strengthen the programs and services of the Foundation, and elicit good practices.



## **PONDO NG PINOY:**

## 15 Years of Engaging the Filipino in Caring for the Poor



Fullness of life as the vision of founder Archbishop Cardinal Rosales for all especially the poor remains to be the primary guide of Pondo ng Pinoy as it journeys into its fifteen years of mission.

Since the founding of Pondo ng Pinoy in 2004, the movement continues to do evangelization work, encouraging the faithful to live the life of humble stewardship of the poor through little but regular acts of goodness exemplified by the "crumbs" as little as 25 centavo coins. "Theology of the Crumbs" or "Theology of the Little" is Pondo ng Pinoy's unique advocacy – it engages anyone, students, professionals, even the poor towards greater consciousness of poverty by way of gratefully and regularly sharing a small portion of one's time and talent, and money – one's "crumbs" or "mumo" with the view that taken together, these crumbs will make a significant change in people's lives.

Fifteen years past, individuals, parishes, academic institutions, and corporations are still consistently giving their crumbs. From fiscal years 2004 to 2019,

crumbs collection has amounted to around PhP 400 million that are translated into projects and aids for the empowerment of poor communities. To date, "crumbs distribution" has helped around 250,000 individuals and communities through projects on health and nutrition, livelihood, education, housing, and occasionally, emergency relief.F

All these initiatives towards integral evangelization, as the drive of Pondo ng Pinoy is also in alignment with the Philippine Church's celebration of the fifth centenary of the arrival of Christianity in the country. Its evangelization helps elicit the "missionary zeal" of every person by participating in works for the poor even in small regular acts, in bringing the Good News to the poor and to those who have drifted from the faith and to those of other faiths through inclusive projects, and in forming the youth in active faith. **Like the mustard seed, may Pondo ng Pinoy contribute significantly in church renewal as we celebrate the great jubilee in 2021.** (Mayee Abear-Marzan, PnPCFI News)

### **EMPOWERMENT OF THE GIVER**

A street sweeper, a priest and an employee of the National Management Office shared their personal stories that makes the listeners inspire and realize their life purpose during the Pondo ng Pinoy's 15th General Assembly held on October 1, 2019 at the Pope Pius XII Catholic Center, United Nations Avenue, Paco, Manila with the theme "15 Years of Engaging the Filipino in Caring for the Poor." Miss Emelia Sapitula, Crumbs Contributor form Baseco, Tondo Manila shared her inspiring story about collecting 25 cents while cleaning the streets. "I am a street sweeper. Whenever I sweep the road and find 25 cents, I save it and donate to Pondo ng Pinoy.

Before, when I did not know about Pondo ng Pinoy, it all goes to grocery stores -to buy soap and other necessities," Sapitula cited. She mentioned that saving as little as 25 cents eventually adapt by her grandchild.
